



What do you love most about working at Grand Oaks of Jensen Beach?


I absolutely love the residents, my boss and all my great co-workers. They are like family to me. I also love to help the residents and their families.

Interesting Stories and Forgotten Facts

Courtesy Greg and Alice Luckhardt Ricou Browning, Creature Black Lagoon

The movie, Creature From the Black Lagoon, is considered a classic sci-fi horror film, shown at the Lyric Theatre June 26-28, 1954. Most people in Martin County, however, probably don't know that a local boy, Ricou Browning, played the role of the underwater creature for that thriller.

He was born February 16, 1930 and raised in Jensen Beach. Ricou's father, Clement 'Clem' Walker Browning was an auto salesman in Stuart and his mother, Inez Louise Ricou, a member of one of Jensen's pioneer families. Ricou Browning's maternal grandparents owned the R.R. Ricou and Sons Fish Company in Jensen, which at one time was among the largest fish wholesalers in South Florida!



It probably wouldn't be much of an exaggeration to state that Ricou learned to swim before he could walk. He was never far from water, whether it be the river or ocean, usually swimming and skin diving, at which he excelled. This enjoyable activity soon became a passion, as he often participated in springboard competitions and water shows, all of which would eventually lead to a career in or around the water. Before reaching the teen years, Ricou worked for Grantland Rice films as a swimmer. During the war in the '40s, the Browning family lived in Tallahassee where he was employed at Wakulla Springs, being involved there in underwater shows. He later assisted in clearing and developing Weeki-Wachee Springs as a tourist attraction in Hernando County for a friend, Newton Perry.



Ricou enlisted in the U.S. Air Force, joining the swimming team as an outstanding athlete. After military service, he attended Florida State University and in 1953, Newton Perry, who managed Wakulla Springs, asked Ricou to show the freshwater springs to Jack Arnold, a film director and Scotty Welbourne of Universal Pictures, who were scouting locations for a movie. Arriving at a deep cave in Wakulla, Ricou was filmed swimming in the spring waters with a movie camera which the two men had brought along. A few weeks later he was contacted by Arnold, who had been greatly impressed by the youth's swimming style and offered him a sizable sum of money to play the role of the 'gill-man' in Universal-International's proposed movie, Creative from the Black Lagoon. Young 23-year-old Ricou replied, "Fine. Let's have at it."

REMEMBER AND HONOR



DECORATION DAY

Memorial Day used to be called Decoration Day, named for the practice of decorating graves and memorials with flowers, wreaths, and flags.

DAY OF REMEMBRANCE

Memorial Day is supposed to be a solemn day of remembrance of all those who died as members of the American Armed Forces.

FIRST MEMORIAL DAY

The holiday first began after the Civil War as a way to honor and mourn the approximately 620,000 Union and Confederate soldiers who died.

3-DAY WEEKEND

The holiday was originally celebrated annually on May 30. The passing of the Uniform Monday Holiday Act in 1971 officially made Memorial Day the last Monday in May.

NATIONAL CELEBRATION

Memorial Day is commemorated annually at Arlington Cemetery in Virginia. The President or Vice President traditionally lays a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in remembrance.
